

Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta Conservancy Releases its Request for Proposal

The Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta Conservancy released its Request for Proposals (RFP) for its Strategic Plan Completion on Tuesday, May 10, 2011. Proposal deadline is Friday, May 27, 2011. A complete timeline for the RFP process is available [here](#).

The RFP presents information for prospective contractors to submit a proposal to complete the Conservancy's Strategic Plan. The Conservancy needs a highly qualified contractor with extensive, relevant experience to provide: (1) facilitation and project management and (2) technical services for the Strategic. Areas of needed expertise include strategic planning, public meeting facilitation, public outreach, as well as a broad range of technical research or information synthesis including, but not limited to, ecosystem restoration, agriculture and working landscapes, economic development, and engineering.

The schedule for this RFP process includes a deadline for written questions, May 17; a pre-bid conference, where potential proposers can ask technical questions regarding the RFP; and the final submittal deadline, Friday, May 27, 2011. Final interviews are anticipated for mid-June and contract approval for early July.

The Conservancy is a state agency within the Natural Resources Agency that was established through legislation on February 3, 2010.

The Conservancy is a primary state agency to implement ecosystem restoration in the Delta in collaboration and cooperation with local governments and interested parties. In addition, the Conservancy is to lead efforts that advance both environmental protection and the economic well-being of Delta residents in a complementary manner. These are the Conservancy's co-equal responsibilities.

Under its co-equal responsibilities, the Conservancy has a broad array of other charges including protecting and preserving Delta agriculture and working landscapes and assisting the Delta regional economy through targeted investments.
